Overview of the 2012/13 Academic Year (Appendix 1.1)

It was yet another busy year for the CIT Student GAA Club with a full calendar of games and training since we started back last September. By enlarge our Senior and Intermediate teams could report on good turn outs for games and other activities and the same could be said for the Ladies Football and Camogie club. Commitment by all of these teams were very impressive and despite winning National honours the CIT Student GAA Club can be very pleased with the application and dedication of the vast majority of players at these level. Congratulations to our Intermediate and Junior Football teams who won at Munster Level League and Championship Competitions. The two Ladies Senior sides made it through to their respective cup intervarsity weekend while the Fitzgibbon and Sigerson Cup sides made the quarter finals of their competitions. The Hurlers it could be fair to say were probably the most unlucky of all the teams being beaten by the narrowest of margins by UCC in a great game in the Mardyke by holders and eventual winners UCC.

For the first time since I began this job in 2000 we have seen a poor turnout in relation to fresher's – both in standard and attendance. This seemed to be reflected across the board in all the other sports and it is something that has generated a lot of thought and discussion at both club and college authority level. We are at presently reviewing our recruitment and introduction structure and we hope to try and develop an approach that might attract more players to become involved. That said we were still in a position to field two teams in both Fresher Hurling and Football and while the first teams remained competitive it was the second teams that found it hard to compete and struggled (but never failed) to field teams. Changes in the levels that our second teams played I feel did not help and in particular the Fresher 2 team were pitted in a group that consisted of 1st teams from Waterford, MICL, LIT and Tralee IT. Heavy defeats certainly played a significant part in the deterioration of interest in this group. That said I feel that in both Hurling and Football we have secured some very good players who are committed and capable of advancing into the next level over their time here at CIT and thanks to the help of all those involved with the various fresher teams this year we have unearthed some students who will also go on to become active in the administration of the various clubs and teams.

As has been stated in previous reports, the purpose or aim of the Student GAA Club in CIT is to encompass a sense of community identity through the medium of our National Games. Its objective is to make all aspects of the Gaelic Athletic Association, be it playing, coaching or administration, accessible to all that attend or work at the Institute. We aspire to encourage involvement in the hope that the experiences gained at Third level will encourage students to become active in their own communities long after they finish their formal education. This is essentially the barometer we use to determine whether or not the year has been a success. Victories on the field of play are only meaningful when they are as a consequence of these aims being lived up to. It is fair to say therefore, that while there were some notable successes as well as hard felt heartbreak throughout the club this season, all those involved in 2012/13 can be proud in manner which they flew the flag of CIT in the Higher Education GAA Competitions and upheld the aims of the club.

Another good barometer for how the clubs are going is the Cork County Championships and in particular the interest and enthusiasm shown here is always a reflection of how involved players feel with their clubs. Both the Hurlers and Footballers won their first game comfortably in their group serious and there was a positive response to practice games and trainings. These are not easy teams to run as they coincide with the busy home club activity, inter-county activity and the exam season. So their involvement in these competitions, which is a decision that the officers take annually, is to be commended. At the time of writing the Footballers must play UCC again after their 4th round game ended level after extra time. The hurlers unfortunately were beaten after extra-time in the 3rd round game with Imokilly at the second time of asking after their first game was called off midway through as a result of a serious injury of an Imokilly player. The replay came only four days after the first game and CIT had to field without a number of regulars due to home club commitments. It was unfortunate timing but you couldn't fault their effort. These games are a good way for Fresher's to get to know the seniors and provide a good stepping stone for the young players into the senior ranks.

CIT GAA Club – Student Support Programme

CIT Student GAA Club has long established a strong commitment to the education and social inclusion principles promoted by the Institute. Over the last number of years we have, through partnership with all key stakeholders, establish strong links in all the various facets of the Student Support Services and have developed a reputation of being student friendly and student centred. Many of our members would avail of these links to Educational, Career and Social Supports. While our primary objective is to make all aspects of the Gaelic Athletic Association, playing, coaching and administration, accessible to all that attend or work at the Institute – the student support model is vital in maintaining a sense of community identity through the medium of our National Games. It is the view of the executive of the CIT Student GAA Club that the positive experiences gained at CIT will encompass a strong sense of belonging and encourage students to become active in their own communities long after they finish their formal education.

Foundation and Award 1 Coaching (Appendix 1.2)

This year we have a total of 75 students completed successfully the Foundation and Award 1 Coaching in Hurling and Football. While in the main the majority were from the recreation and leisure course we had a number of students from other courses throughout the campus who took this module as part of their CIT elective. The course was Co-ordinated by Con Burns and assisted by Keith Ricken

Community Coaching (Appendix 1.5)

We ran a number of projects involving our bursary students and club coaches to groups/communities and clubs re coaching. As part of our contribution to the Cork Life Long Festival where we had over 200 children attended for coaching with our "Sports Stars" in Hurling/Football and Ladies Football and Camogie. The vast majority of the clubs invited were clubs who had links to the DEIS Primary Schools programmes in Cork City, but we did open it up to members of the public which added considerably to numbers.

As a follow on from this we invited the DEIS primary schools in for a series of Coaching Days in June. We also have invited in a number of Secondary schools and have targeted 1st Years.

In November we ran a very successful CITY Camogie Workshop in cooperation with Deirdre Murphy and the Munster Coaching Development programme. 60 young Camogie players aged 15-18 from 15 Cork City Camogie Clubs took part in an evening of expert Camogie Coaching from CIT's leading coaches Frank Flannery (CIT Graduate) and Fergal O'Leary (CIT Camogie Senior Coach). There was great back from this activity and the Camogie Club really can commend for their efforts on this.

This year we also invited some of 2nd Schools to bring in Senior Football teams for a coaching workshop and followed it up with games against a Fresher Selection. This proved very successful and we hope to expand this to more schools over the next few years, in both hurling and football.

We have hosted a number of sample hurling and football session for international students as part of CIT International Students week and also we have hosted students from visiting colleges from Europe and the US.

Charity Fund Raising Events

As part of the Student GAA Club's commitment to contributing to the community we continued again this year raise monies for our Adopted Charity, which this year was for Suicide Aware. A very successful coffee morning which had huge numbers of students, staff and members of the community come to listen to the inspirational Donal Óg Cusack and members of the Suicide Aware team talk on what is a very prominent and important topic of Mental Awareness. Overall, a sum of €1,500+ was raised on the day and the student organising committee which was chaired by Lorcan McLoughlin and ably assisted by Eoin Byrne and Liam Bergin worked tremendously hard to ensure it was a success. We also involved Master's students form the Business and Marketing class to help out and their assistance was invaluable.

Gym Education Programme

John Neville was also very much involved in putting together and coordinating Fitness and Gym programmes for our non-elite students and in particular our Fresher and Female teams. John became qualified as a fitness instructor through CIT Recreation and Leisure as well as working part-time as the college gym instructor. His aim was to introduce the players to exercises performed in the CIT Elite Gym. The main goals of these sessions was to educate players on how to perform basic movement skills while also developing output levels of strength, power and flexibility.

CIT as a Centre of GAA Excellence (Appendix 1.3)

CIT continues to expand and develop its growing reputation as a centre of sporting excellence and in particular has now established a very good working relationship with the various different facets of the Gaelic Athletic Association. This year we saw the Cork Senior Hurlers base themselves here as their centre for training and the Cork Senior Footballers were no strangers either. Cork Minor and U21 teams availed of our facilities and many of the various Cork underage development teams base themselves here during the summer months. 2013 will again see Comhairle na Mumhan use CIT for their Óg Iomáint and Óg Peil Fé14 programmes. We also encourage our City Division to bring their teams in and as always we facilitate with Logistical, Personnel and Equipment for their u14 school of these teams. We are also the base for the Cork Ladies Football underage development programme and have a sizable Camogie activity here also. We have agreed with Rebel Óg to be their main venue for their semi-finals and finals of their championships.

Bursaries 2011/12 (Appendix 1.4)

We are very grateful to CIT, Munster Council, EMC and Cadburys for their continued support of our Bursary scheme for GAA players at Cork Institute of Technology. In total they were 54 Bursaries awarded for GAA (which included 7 GPA Bursaries) which varied in amounts from €500 to €1000 and totalled a commitment of almost €39,000 for 2012/13 Academic Year. The vast majority of these players met the required standard set out but the various bodies responsible and were supervised and mentored to the highest standards. We have though had difficulties in relation to Bursary Students being available to the Institute for games and training. In particular we had issues pertaining to two Munster Counties where players were expected to train, irrespective of the studies, travel arrangements and college GAA games/training, with their counties 3-4 times a week. These were therefore unavailable to the college despite being awarded a bursary. It also meant, more significantly that these young men were on the road, travelling big distances on winters nights, at least twice a week back for “squad training”. Some of these players were well off the Senior Inter-County standard at the moment – mainly because of their age and physique and so were also the beck and call of u21 management at club and county. We have brought this to the attention of the Munster Coaching and Games on a numerous of occasions but there doesn’t seem to be the energy or commitment to tackle the issue. This is in stark contrast with some of counties who are very facilitating with both the needs of the student and in particular recognise the students’ academic, health and college sporting commitments and are in constant contact with either team management and or the GAA Office regarding the welfare and development of their players. We have also expressed our necessity to seek more clarification on GPA Bursaries and involve them in our process. Their active involvement in the selection criteria, process and monitoring would be welcomed, but there seems to be very little information regarding their own expectations of a GPA bursary recipient and reluctance to work under the same terms of their parent organisation the GAA. Below please the recipients for the 2012/13 Academic Year and the amounts given out.

Team Reports

Fitzgibbon – Senior Hurling

After the great run in 2011/12 which ended in defeat in the 2012 Fitzgibbon Cup Final the club had to dust them down and start out again this year. When you consider that 10 members of the previous side had now graduated it was really a case of rebuilding. Yet the spirit and professional approach of the last number of years was again in evident this year and although the league was very much a non-event we did keep our Division 1 status and blooded a number of new players. In the Fitzgibbon the team defeated league finalists Carlow IT but lost to WIT in Waterford. Despite this they finished 2nd in their group which saw them pitted against current holders UCC in the ¼ final at the Mardyke. A huge crowd turned up to see a repeat of last year's final and although we had a sizeable number of debutants we certainly gave 100% only to be caught at the death. Injuries to a number of key players didn't do us any favours but our performance reflected the huge effort and dedication given by this outfit – players and management alike. UCC went on to win out the competition comfortably and while the Holy Grail still eludes us we are certainly proud of the efforts and commitment shown by our players.

Intermediate Hurling

The Intermediate Hurling team again put in a big effort this year. Great credit must be given to the management as they trained separately to the senior team and built a great atmosphere within training and practice games. Yet with many of their 2012 panel being drafted into the Senior Ranks, it was always going to be hard work rebuilding a side that would challenge for honours. Yet despite this they performed admirably in many of their games with physique and experience catching them in the final stages of most games. Many of this team will be here for another few years so we are hopeful to get back to producing a team that will push for honours sooner rather than later.

Fresher Hurling

As was stated earlier on in the report the fresher hurlers did not set the world alight this year. The lower numbers signing up and the standard at the early trial games suggested that while we have a number of county minors and good club players the numbers of these would not sustain being able to push for ultimate honours. Despite this, we did manage to put together a fairly decent Fresher 1 team many of whom will play Fitzgibbon hurling over the next few years however the limited panel of players mean we had a very mixed league performance. We did get out what should have been a very reasonable Championship side but were unlucky to have met a LIT side whose greater physique saw them run out convincing winners in a game played at the Limerick venue. As a consequence of having a limited Fresher 1 panel the fresher 2 numbers were subsequently affected and they found it difficult to get players out for training and practice games. It has forced us as a club to look at addressing this for 2014 and we will have to implement more activities and structures in entice them to play. That said on an awful night for hurling they put up a credible display against WIT in the Championship and fielded a reasonably strong side for this grade to be beaten by 5 points. Overall Fresher championship preparations are being severely hampered by the month off in January as a number of players would have had to travel long distances and so training and practice matches are very disjointed. There are also a lot of Club U21 and tournament games that cut across their preparation and even in January there are a number of Inter-County “trial games” pulling out of the same players. While there is a lot of talk on player burn-out there doesn’t seem to be a whole lot being done to monitor player activity for the 18-21 age group

Senior Football

The Senior Footballers put in a great effort again this academic year but fell short in all three competitions. They reached the league ¼ final losing after extra time to St. Mary’s. They lost narrowly to Cork in the McGrath Cup after an excellent display. After a good first round victory over GMIT in the Sigerson Cup, the campaign came to a disappointing end with defeat to hosts Athlone I.T in Athlone in the ¼ final. Trainer Niall McIntyre, Manager Mick Dillon and his selectors are to be congratulated for the huge effort they put into the team and despite falling short this year in Sigerson, the work ethic and commitment displayed will surely stand to the players in the future.

Intermediate Football

The intermediate team put in a great year again this year playing 11 games with just 2 defeats. Unfortunately, the team was unable to reclaim the All Ireland title won last year, losing out to I.T Carlow in the semi-final with an injury depleted team. The team contained many excellent players who will no doubt play Sigerson in the coming seasons. They did however secure Munster success in League and Championship and we were absolutely delighted with the huge efforts that they put in this year.

Junior Football

Junior Footballers is provided for lads who want to play “Social Football”. This year they only played one league game against UCC which also doubled as a championship final. We won that game by 4 points and qualified for the All Ireland series which was held in Maynooth. We unfortunately lost out in the semi-final of the cup to DIT, who played their Intermediate team, but we subsequently won the shield final defeating NUIG.

Fresher Football

The Fresher 1 Footballers put in a huge effort again this year but were defeated in the first round of championship by eventual champions DCU. They were also narrowly defeated in the league quarter final by UCD. Low playing numbers and a large number of injuries hampered the Fresher’s somewhat this year, but they can be proud of their efforts and there were a number of players who will certainly play Sigerson for the college in future seasons.

The Fresher 2 Football team competed in the Division 2 League which was a bit unfair as they were up against mostly Fresher 1 teams from other colleges. They never the less put in a good effort and competed well in all their games. We would hope all these players would continue playing with the college intermediate and junior teams going forward.

County Championship

The football county championship campaign is still on going at the time of writing. After a big win over Imokilly in Round 1, we were drawn to face our rivals UCC in the final round of the Colleges/Divisions section. After a pulsating clash in Páirc Uí Rinn, the sides could not be separated in a 15 points all thriller. This is a very talented team and certainly has the potential to make a big impression if they can manage to advance in the replay on Monday June 3rd. It was heartening to see the great bond developing between the Fresher’s and existing Senior and Intermediate players, which bode well for the future no matter what the outcome for this team.

For the first time in a number of years the Senior Hurlers bowed out of the County Championship before the ¼ final. This was not due in any part to lack of interest but more to the lack of older and experienced players and some poor timing. Having put in a very impressive display against Duhallow they had a difficult assignment

against seasoned divisional side Imokilly. We have played these a number of times over the years and there was never much in these clashes. This year was no different. An unfortunate injury to an Imokilly player on the first night saw the game being abandoned. This was absolutely the right decision on a part of all concerned but we had a very strong side out and looked by far the better side before the referee called off the game. The replay was played three days later and a number of our players were not available to us due to club commitments. That said it was a last minute goal in extra-time which put pay to our run in this year's championship. It could be fair to say that the absence of luck definitely played its part this year.

Conclusion

The CIT GAA Club would like to sincerely thank all who contributed to another very busy year in 2012/13. In particular we would like to thank all the members, players, mentors, logistic personnel, board delegates, club officers, associated members and supporters. We would also like to thank the Institute for their continued support of our games both financially and otherwise. In particular Dr Barry O Connor Vice President and Registrar of CIT for his role in ensuring that the GAA receives the recognition and support necessary and for proper development of our National games. We are indebted also to all in the Student Services Support Team under the stewardship of Dr Dan Collins and Ms Fiona Kelly for all their assistance. I would like to thank all my colleagues in the Sports, Medical, Sports Facilities and the wider Institute Support Structures for their unequivocally backing during what is for everybody a very busy and pressured time frame. I would in particular like to thank the ground staff supervised by Ger Neff. They do an absolutely fantastic job in ensuring our facilities are up to the standard required and without whose help we would not be able to do what we do.

The overall GAA Community also play their part and we at the Institute are grateful for the work of the full-time personnel and volunteers at National and Provincial Comhairle Ardoideachais, Higher Education Ladies Football and the Camogie third level committee. Also to the many GAA Development officers at the other colleges whose cooperation and commitment is the major reason why our National Games continue to dominate the sporting landscape of the Irish Higher Educational Institutions. Finally we would like to thank the GAA and in particular Comhairle na Mumhan and Coiste Chontae Chorcaí for their continued financial backing and the continuance of the very successful GAA Bursary Scheme.
